



SUNRISE, SUNSET

Which is more beautiful, sunrises or sunsets? Why? Simple questions with answers that may run quite deep. I've always enjoyed sunsets over Lake Michigan. I've seen sunsets over the Pacific Ocean on numerous occasions while in California, and they are not nearly as beautiful as those over Lake Michigan, whether viewed in St. Joseph in the south or the Leelenau Peninsula in the north. I do grant California an asterisk, however, because of the marine layer (fog) that so often rolls onto land in the evening. There may be days when the California coastal aesthetics are better, but not when I was there.

This probably isn't a true survey because there are more people who see sunsets versus sunrises because of the obvious - there are more people awake when the sun sets than when it rises. Count me in that group that doesn't see many sunrises at this time of year. Perhaps I

will make the effort one of the days we will spend along the Atlantic coast next week while on vacation.

What brought this line of thinking to me was that I heard the song "Sunrise, Sunset" from the "Fiddler on the Roof "movie playing while contemplating what my topic was going to be. Of course, the song lyrics have nothing to do with the sun rising or setting, but are a metaphor for life, as Ukrainian parents Teyve and Golde reflect on the upcoming marriage of their daughter to a boy from their village. Here's a sampling of the lyrics:

[TEVYE]

Is this the little girl I carried? Is this the little boy at play?
[GOLDE]

I don't remember growing older. When did they?

[TEVYE]

When did she get to be a beauty? When did he grow to be so tall? [GOLDE]

Was't it yesterday when they were small?
[MEN]

Sunrise, sunset, sunrise, sunset, swiftly flow the days -Seedlings turn overnight to sunflowers, blossoming even as we gaze.

[WOMEN]

Sunrise, sunset, sunrise, sunset, swiftly fly the years One season following another, laden with happiness and tears.

When we look through the eyes of Teyve and Golde, sunrise and sunset take on a whole new meaning. All of a sudden I'm not so enthused about sunsets. I'd like my sun to hang up in the sky a while longer. I am writing this on Father's Day, a day when dads can reflect on the sunrises in their lives, when their children were born and hope was in abundance -- their future unlimited. Now they've had their own sunrises. I will have baptized my newest grand child Alora in Tennessee by the time this hits print. Alora, by the way, means "God's light" in Hebrew -- quite appropriate in a story about sunrises and sunsets, wouldn't you say? Eric




