



The Paradox of Freedom

I'm about to be drawn into some dangerous waters, with the very real possibility of being a victim of a strong undertow. Normally, I am very wary of such waters, being one who tends to play it safe rather than to challenge danger. I'm heading to a place that I probably don't belong, but for some reason can't resist.

This column's topic involves 20th century Catholic writer and philosopher G. K. Chesterton, but it is not specifically about him. When I've referenced Chesterton here previously, it has usually been when a quote of his has turned up on my flip calendar, not because I have read and absorbed any of his writings. Chesterton's philosophy of life, in general, is that life is a story (ours), and thus has a storyteller (God). His work generated a great following, some of which is captured by the two academics noted in the next paragraph.

What has drawn me to this point is the foreword to a book. Not the book

and its content per se, but the foreword. In this case the foreword is written by Dale Ahlquist, the head of an international group known as the "The Society of Gilbert Keith Chesterton". In noting Chesterton's great ability to grasp the meaning of life, Ahlquist summarizes the work of author Brady Stiller in his Chesterton retrospective "Your Life is a Story:"

Chesterton put everything together. By studying both biology and theology, Brady (Stiller) was also putting everything together. Biology is the study of life. It's Slippery. Theology is the logic of God. It's dry. But you can't afford to get either of them wrong. To get life wrong could mean death. To get God wrong, could mean damnation. But for the past century or so...science and religion have kept to their own departments.

The closing statement there reflects the centuries old debate between science and religion, or as scholars such as St. Thomas Aquinas framed it -- between faith and reason. Aquinas and others argued persuasively that faith and reason are compatible -- that truth doesn't necessarily have to be one or the other. For example,

we can say that God created the universe and that the universe came about after "The Big Bang" and each can be true -- as long as we understand that it was God who initiated the "bang."

But actually, the part of Stiller's quote I propose for some summer perusal is that we can't afford to get biology and theology wrong because: To get life wrong could mean death. To get God wrong could mean damnation. We are pitting our relatively short earthly life against eternal life. Whatever philosophy of life with which we most closely align ourselves we need to "get God right." We need to have him first in our life.

Stiller tells us that for Chesterton, the most properly constituted form of freedom is to purposely order life according to God's objective order. In other words, the paradox of freedom is that properly-ordered freedom is limited by the parameters of Christianity's desire to follow God's plan -- free within boundaries, a paradox indeed!


