Do You Think Jesus Was Humorous?

A priest, a minister and a rabbi walk into a bar. The bartender, who was washing glasses, stops, looks up and says "What is this A JOKE?" (Cue rim shot)

Maybe that brought a groan or a grin, but probably not a guffaw, but then again it's the type of joke that's not intended to bring outloud laughter, but rather a smile. Maybe it breaks a sour mood or helps "turn a frown upside down." Under any of those scenarios the simple joke has achieved its purpose.

Usually in July, when I'm out vacationing and not feeling all that insightful or theological, I just grab a couple jokes from one of the three books of Catholic jokes in my library and just pass them along. The opening joke was from one of those books. But this year is a little bit different in that this July slot comes right after Pope Francis invited comedians from all over the world to Rome for an audience with him.

The pope thanked the comics, in essence, just for being funny. Pope Francis thanked them for helping people laugh, giving them a release from the pressures of life. He even said it was okay for them to occasionally make a joke about God. Well-known American comedians like Jimmy Fallon, Stephen Colbert, Whoopi Goldberg, Julie Louse Dreyfuss and Chris Rock were among those attending.

Colbert, who hosts a late night talk show, told his audience the next week how honored he was to meet the pope, although he reminded them: "You know I have made jokes about the pope and Catholicism in the past, and now I am extremely happy that they never got translated into Italian."

Here we are, more than halfway through the column, and I haven't addressed the question I posed at the beginning. That's because I think 99.9 percent of those reading this believe that the answer is "Yes, of course, Jesus had a sense of humor." The remaining 0.1 percent are probably out washing their hands with 99.44 percent pure lvory soap. An analytical response would be that Jesus was truly human as well as truly divine and showed emotions like anger and sadness in the gospels, so he most likely laughed as well. And since he was usually the center of attention, there were probably times that he let a great one-liner go every now and then. In the TV series "The Chosen" he is definitely shown to have a sense of humor, some of which came from his occasional disillusionment with his apostles. He might have offered a first-century edition of this joke:

"A boy asked his father for the keys to the car and the father responded by saying 'Not until you get a haircut.' To which the boy replied 'Jesus had long hair.' And the father responded, 'Yes, and he walked everywhere.'"
