



### Writing 101 - Words

I am often asked about writing this column and my writing background. Mostly the questions center on how I come up with ideas every week for the column. I've dealt with those before, noting that most just come in observation of life. I might see something in a magazine, I might observe something in my life or an idea might come from the Holy Spirit while I face writer's block and a time deadline.

But on occasion I turn to the words of others who are wiser or more eloquent than I. Such is the case today, when I look to my trusty flip calendar and see a quote from St. John Henry Newman that is not only poignant but touches on the idea of ideas, or perhaps more precisely -- words: "Nothing is more common than for people to think that because they are familiar with words, they understand the ideas they stand for." (Newman is a saint, so I guess that means that Jesus doesn't take points off for ending a sentence with a preposition. Good to know.) This is something I was very careful about a few weeks ago in talking about G. K. Chesterton's "Paradox of Freedom." When it comes to philosophy, I can often read and understand each individual word and still draw an unintended conclusion.

Which draws us to the power of words and word choice. I consciously watch my words. I love to play with words in a humorous way, but if I am dealing with a serious subject I am wary of misusing a word. In my homily yesterday, my focus was on the need for Catholics to be united at this point in history, yet I also snuck in a "fun" word, swashbucklers. It didn't detract from the homily's focus, but it added a smile.

It's time to confess that my first instinct today was to rip the Olympic planners for allowing the mockery of the Last Supper in its opening ceremony. But I concluded that I will let the bishops handle that. I try hard to make this column thoughtful, but I avoid joining in the negativity and hate so common in our culture. If there is one word I would like associated with this column it is "hope." I pray my readers see that.

NOTES: The Catholic Biblical School of Michigan will make a short presentation before Masses next weekend (Aug. 10-11) promoting its four-year biblical program that will start up at Most Holy Trinity Parish in Fowler. Several St. Joe parishioners (including myself) took this class when it was presented in Westphalia several years ago and it was most recently offered at St. Thomas Aquinas in East Lansing. Fowler is the closest location to St. Johns it has been offered. I strongly recommend taking the program.

On another note, I would like to announce that Catholic historian Phillip Campbell will make a return to St. Joe's on Saturday October 5th, so mark your calendar. Phillip's appearance last spring filled the church's coffee and donut room, so this presentation will be at the Columbian Hall (K of C) for more seating and handicap accessibility. His topic: Catholicism in a traditionally Protestant Country -- the United States.




