



CHANGE

"Turn and face the strange" is a phrase that really describes the month of September. The recurring line in the song "Changes" by David Bowie reminds us that life requires us to face changes in our lives, especially the changes that catch us by surprise and seem strange at the time. It's emblematic of the month of September, a month of transition -- some of which feels routine, but offers also the "new" or strange.

It may not seem like it this weekend, but September marks a transition from summer to fall. Meteorologists consider the whole month of September as the first month of fall, while "calendar people" (for lack of a better term) tell us that autumn starts around the 21st or 22nd of the month when we pass the autumnal equinox. But there is more to the change in September than weather and hours of sunlight.

Sports fans are facing the "strange" this month. The Detroit Tigers are playing meaningful baseball, the Detroit Lions are being picked as possible Super Bowl contenders, MSU football is watchable and Wolverine fans are looking at a year that will be a couple steps down from last year's national football championship. Though sports may seem frivolous, many of us wrap ourselves up emotionally in games played by other adults. We can let these changes control moods.

For those with children, of course, this marks the change from summer fun back to the routine that comes with the school year. But how familiar that routine feels for both parents and children can depend on what grades the children are entering. If they are moving into a new school, there is considerable "strange" to the students change. Who are my teachers going to be? Where are my classrooms? Are any of my friends going to be in my classes? These are just a few of the questions that may arise in students' minds, and how we approach these changes for our children will go a long way in helping them "turn and face the change"-- relieving anxiety.

Scripture tells us to avoid anxiety. In Matthew 6:27 Jesus asks us: "Can any of you by worrying,

add a single moment to your life." And a few verses later (6:34) the Lord tells us: "Do not worry about tomorrow, tomorrow will take care of itself." The temperature last week dropped down into the low 40s a couple of nights. I have no doubt that there were more than a few people who thought "Oh no, here comes winter." An inability to face the "eventual" change to winter weather, makes life difficult for some. If we know such people, help them face the fact that change doesn't always mean strange.

Let us all remember that change is inevitable. Jesus' disciples faced change daily, moving from town to town never knowing what was coming next. They had no idea what was coming around the next bend. Yet no matter the strangeness of any of the changes they faced, they knew they could handle them, as long as they had their unshakable leader Jesus with them. It's no different with us. Jesus is always with us as we hear in Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus is the same yesterday today and tomorrow." Let's "face the strange" with Jesus.


