

Our Gifts Are For Giving

You can call them gifts, you can call them charisms or you can call them talents, ("but you doesn't hasta to call me Johnson").* These unique features and qualities we possess come from God, not for our own edification but for the good of others. There is a new opportunity for parishioners of different age groups to use their gifts of leadership, creativity and vision in concert with their Catholic faith as part of the new adult faith formation team.

I'm not just going to repeat what **Christian Initiation Director** Amanda Grigar had to say in her talks before Masses this weekend, but I would like to emphasize the need for a well-balanced team to be assembled. This an opportunity, especially for faithful parishioners 40ish or younger, to have input into what type of faith education opportunities your age group desires. Maybe it's quest speakers, maybe it's short three or four-week presentations on a specific faith-related topic, or maybe it's opportunities to watch Formed videos and have discussions. But we want a few people from each of three age groups so that everyone's faith needs can be met.

Every week, the St. Joe bulletin has an accounting of monetary gifts to the parish under the heading of "Stewardship." But stewardship is more than the giving of money. It also includes the gifts of time and talent as well. And this new team is not going to have to meet often, but the team's combined talents can reap great rewards for the parish community at-large, as well as the team members.

Father Chas Conoy has a great column in the September issue of *Faith* magazine on the discovery of personal talents and the rewards they may reap. Fr. Chas quotes St. John Henry Neuman's take on how God has called all of us to specific work

God has created me to do him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I should be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not

created me for naught. I shall do good. I shall do his work.

Be this chain link and that bond between persons. This team is for you whether you're 35, 55 or 75 years old. Share your talents. Gifts are for giving.




