

(and whatever else is on Deacon Eric's mind)

Happy, Happy, Joy, Joy We can't let today go by without giving a shout-out to our school: Happy Birthday, St. Joseph School, you may be 100 years old today, but with your "full facial" this summer, you look great. Let's look back at the school's early history and let's set Mr. Peabody's Way-back Machine for 1923.

In August of 1923, St Joe parishioners held a church and mortgage burning ceremony at the site of the proposed new school. Before the new structure could go up, of course, an old structure had to come down. So a week after the mortgage burning event, workers started demolishing the old C.B. Giffel's home just east of the church on Cass Street.

On September 8th, there was a moment that would go down in parish history - perhaps I should say up, then down in parish history. It seems there was a stubborn apple tree stump at the rear of the Giffel's property, so dynamite was used to blow it up. And

up it went - way up. When, as the law of gravity requires, it came down, it crashed through the roof of neighbor William Smith's home - reportedly shaking up Smith's daughter. Fortunately, no injuries were reported. I'm guessing they were a bit more careful in getting the stump out of the upper floor room of the Smith home than they were in getting it out of the ground.

Excavation of the site began the next week, but before it was completed, Pastor Thomas Carey was transferred to Lapeer and was not able to be around for the laying of the cornerstone the next spring. That job went to the new pastor, Fr. Vincent Hankerd who did the honor in May 1924. In his remarks that day, Fr. Hankerd praised the generosity of the donors to the school project and offered hope for those who were to pass through the school:

"It is the wish of the writer of this record," he said, "that who ever reads it may be able to judge that there was earnest piety in the hearts of those who gave generously for the building, and may he enjoy in his time, blessings of religious charity and goodness that the school taught and influenced."

By the end of the summer, the school was completed. On September 8, 1924, exactly one year after the flying tree stump incident, the new school's doors opened and children in grades one through eight were greeted by the teachers - sisters of Saint Joseph from Nazareth Michigan near Kalamazoo.

Newcomers to the parish may not know, but the original school building as just described is actually the middle portion of the current school. The front section of the school just renovated was built in 1959 and the back of today's school (the part with the gym) was built in 1963. And we have lived up to Fr. Hankerd's hope that the thousands of children who have passed through St. Joe's doors enjoyed "blessings of religious charity and goodness that the school taught and influenced." May God continue to bless Principal Chris Wells and our dedicated staff of teachers and aides during the 2024-25 year.



But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. We encourage and invite all adult members of our faith community (18 years or older) to register. Registration shows you belong. Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptisms, weddings, and when asked to be a Godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. 


