

Turkeys and Knights and Joes, Oh My!

So, what else is on my mind today? Well, there's a few items that I would like to highlight, but there's not enough space to give them each their full due, so I think I'll call the following "The Deacon's Delicatessen." Or maybe "The Sunday Smorgasbord" might be more fitting. I can't decide. Talk among yourselves and make your own choice. I'm so verklempt.

KNIGHTS -- I would like to start today with a shout-out to Knights of Columbus Council 3281, which celebrated it's 75 th Anniversary last Sunday with an Open House at the newly renovated Columbian Hall. Close to 150 people attended, enjoying hamburgers and grilled hot dogs (the only way to cook a hot dog in my mind) and a nice presentation honoring past Grand Knights, followed by a moment of silence for those Knights who have headed to their heavenly home. The hall itself looks great, by the way, with its new drywall lining the whole building --a far cry from the outdated paneling that had outlived its time. The Knights hope the fresh look will be very appealing to those looking for wedding reception venues and the new Wi-Fi internet access make this a great place for business seminars as well.

Kudos to my brother Knights and everyone else who took part in the planning of the event or in the renovation of the building.

JOES -- I haven't talked up the Average Joes Men's group in the parish for a while, which belies how much I enjoy being part of it. My thought is that maybe there are some men who don't know of the Joes or just can't remember what it is about. from work and home responsibilities for an hour each week and chat with men of faith. Men, stop in and visit with the Joes on Saturday mornings in the church basement from 9:00 - 10:00. You'll be glad you did.

My wife and I are members of the committee of volunteers from several area churches who provide a Thanksgiving meal for anyone at no cost to the diner. (It is not just for the homeless, **it's for everyone**) But we need many volunteers to prepare the food from Monday through Wednesday and to help greet, serve and clean-up on Thanksgiving. It's a great lesson of serving the community that parents can give to their children.


Parish Office Closure
