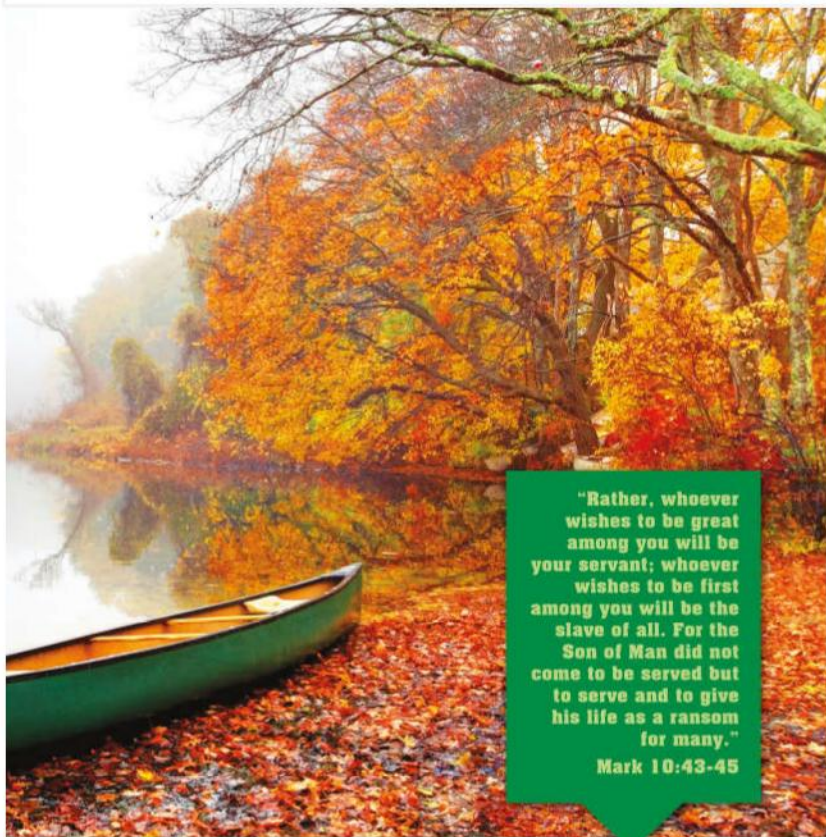

**Educate First, Then
Vote**

In the political season it is easy to get caught up on personalities. But the Church wants us to realize that how a person governs is more important than who governs. “The ethical has primacy over the partisan and the personal,” according to Kishore Jayabalan, acting chair of the Lansing Diocese’s Commission on Catholic Social Teaching (CST). In an article entitled “The Election and You” in this month’s Faith magazine, Jayabalan says our votes should go to the candidates who best meet the Church’s four pillars of CST: human dignity, solidarity, the common good and subsidiarity. “Taken together” Jayabalan says “these principles are the pillars of a society that reflects God’s will for the created order and the natural moral law.”

The Church presents its Catholic Social Teaching as a way of cut-

ting through much of the rhetoric from political candidates. I often hear comments like “I don’t know which of these candidates to trust.” And sadly for many it comes down to, “which of these candidates lies the least?” Having these pillars of CST in mind can help us cut through some less-than-honest comments and get to the core beliefs. Even Pope Francis, when looking at our presidential candidates, told reporters that voters in the United States, when asked specifically about their views on abortion and immigration, said that each of our voters will choose on the “lesser of two evils.” I am pretty sure that was not the intent of our founding fathers.

Let’s look at those two topics briefly under the CST lens. The main reason, of course, that the Church urges us to vote against any pro-abortion candidate or policy is the taking of a baby’s life in the womb. Under the CST umbrella, abortion “violates the principles of human dignity, the common good and solidarity by pitting mothers against their unborn children; and it violates sub-

solidarity by not assisting those most in need who cannot defend themselves,” in Jayabalan’s words. Immigration is not quite as clear-cut, but we have to consider the human dignity of the immigrants, the common good of the sending and receiving countries and the avoidance of treating them, illegal or not, as people, not cattle or even more callously, as numbers.

I would encourage everyone who has not yet voted to take seven or eight minutes to read this article before casting your ballot. But, please everyone, VOTE. I hear people saying that they are so disgusted with the level of politics and what’s going on in our society, that they are not going to cast a ballot. Resist that urge and vote -- and don’t forget the local races. People in power at the state and local level usually get their starts on school boards and city councils. Vote, but first know what type of policy for which you are voting.

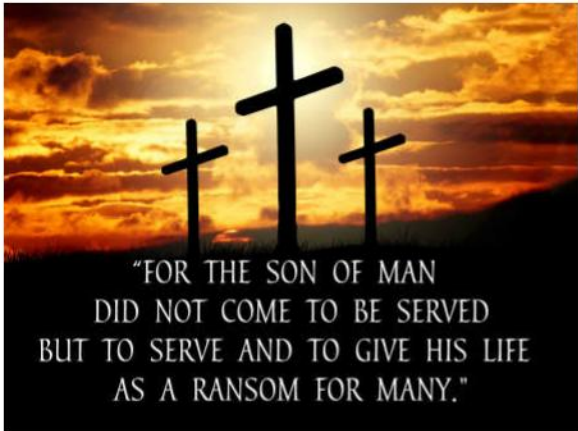

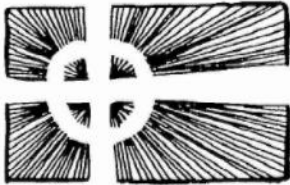
