

Nobody's Going to Read This

"Nobody's going to read this" I said to myself as I prepared to write this column. It's being written early to meet one of the several early deadlines that go with the Christmas season. On top of scrambling for new column ideas, I think I've used up my allotment of "grins" for 2024.

"Nobody's going to read this -- this is the bulletin on the Sunday between Christmas and New Year's," I said to myself. "Nobody's going to spend time reading the bulletin today after having to go to Mass three times in a week. Enough is enough already." And besides, I think I've used up my allotment of poignant thoughts for 2024.

"Nobody's going to read this, there is so much holiday partying and football still

available today -- it's a waste of time to read this Sunday bulletin, isn't it? How many read the Sunday bulletin anytime?," I wondered. Maybe the words of this Longfellow fellow will touch their hearts, because they've had some bombshells in their lives this year and can see that in the end their faith in God will help them get through this difficult holiday season."

And now I think I can do this "Maybe one person will read this and find the words of this Longfellow fellow pertinent to their lives. I'll pray for that person" I said to myself.

Well I guess I made it. Jesus gave me my first Christmas present -enough words to finish 2024. I can look with joy to the new year, chock full of grins and poignancy (God willing) in 2025. God bless you all. See you next year.
