(and whatever else is on Deacon Eric's mind)

The Voice and The Light When we first read of John the Baptist in the gospel of Luke, it is early in chapter one as the angel Gabriel tells John's father Zechariah that though he and his wife were elderly, they would be blessed with a child to be named John. Late in the first chapter, we hear of his circumcision at which he was named John -- to the surprise of many. They were also surprised that Zechariah would affirm that name vocally, since Zechariah had had his voice taken away after initially doubting Gabriel.

Zechariah uses his rediscovered voice to praise God and to announce the role of his son, saying: "You my child shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation, by the forgiveness of their sins." Zechariah uses his voice to announce "The Voice," the one who we hear in today's gospel as the "voice of one crying out in the desert" -- John the Baptist.

This is the message we hear on the second Sunday of Advent everv vear. John the Baptist telling us we need to repent for the forgiveness of sins. And repent means more than asking forgiveness, but a change in our ways -- a turning away from sin and toward the Lord. It's hard to do, but it may be easier if we look at repentance as part of our New Year's resolutions. Here at the start of Advent, we are at the beginning of the new liturgical year. Come January first we will have a running start on becoming a better person, not just a thinner one, if we piggyback a change of character through repentance with a secular resolution to lose weight, save money or other similar resolutions.

If we are hearing the Baptist's voice this season, we know that he is asking us to use one of our other senses as well - sight. In his description of the Baptist's message, we hear that he, in the evangelist John's words, came "to testify to the light." The birth of Jesus, as we are aware, is celebrated just days after the shortest day of the year -- which means, of course, the longest night. The Light of the world arrives at a time he is most needed, when the world is in its deepest dark.

We will mark the longest night here at St. Joe's this year with a candlelight adoration hour. On Friday evening the 20th, the parish's new faith formation team will present an opportunity for all of us to step away from all our Christmas preparation and hullabaloo for a short time, and perhaps get a better personal understanding of the coming of the child Jesus. We will have many of the church lights out, with most of the light emanating from candles. I will read a selection from the evangelist John on the coming of the "Light" and present a short homily. Most importantly we will have a time of quiet for reflection, meditation and adoration -- great tools to use in a season of repentance and adoration.


THE GIVING TREE
