

#### You are Invited:

Rites of Entrance Welcomina & On Sunday, February 2 at the 12:00 noon Mass, the parish

will celebrate the Rite of Entrance into the Order of Catechumens (for those who are unbaptized), and the Rite of Welcoming of the Candidates (for those baptized in a different Christian denomination). In celebrating these rites, those who have been inquiring about Catholicism will officially and publicly declare their intention to enter into a formal relationship with the Catholic Church, learning its ways and participating in its lifestyle. While the two rites share similarities, there are also important differences. For example, the unbaptized will begin the rite outside of the church, and be brought inside by Fr. Mike, and by extension, all of us. Meanwhile, those who are already baptized begin inside the body of the church, as we recognize them as our brothers and sisters in Christ. These rites mark the persons as members of the Catholic Church. However, they will not complete their initiation into full communion until they have received the three sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and the Eucharist.

All of the Catholic faithful have an important role to play in these rites, which is why we request the presence of as many parishioners as possible. During the rites, Fr. Mike will ask parishioners, "Are you ready to journey with these inquirers, helping them to know and follow Christ?" This guestion requires an answer, but first, you should carefully consider the words: how will you journey with them, and how can you help them to know and follow Christ? The answers to these questions will vary, but it is clear that the Church recognizes the crucial role of each person in doing their part to help new faithful on their faith journeys. Please pray for Chris, Jesse, Lindsey, Laureen, Randy, and all those considering becoming Catholic.


