

Being Called and Being Called Home

When I was growing up I lived in a neighborhood where there were many kids whose homes were close together. If I would be at a friend's house, my Mom or one of my siblings could just go out on our front porch and call out "Eric, time for lunch" or something to that effect and I would head straight home -- most of the time. There were times I would hear the call and pretend I didn't because I was in the middle of a game. I always knew, however, that I would have to answer the call. Parents didn't have cell phones to text their children way back yonder, yet they did have something along the lines of a parental authority co-op in which parent B would send a kid home if she heard parent A's call.

Today's gospel, St. Luke's version of the call of the first apostles, shows how, unlike me in my childhood, the apostles answered their call immediately. Obviously, being called from one's livelihood to fol-

low Jesus and being called home for a peanut butter and jelly sandwich are not direct parallels. But sometimes we pretend to not hear God's call in the same way I tried to avoid the call for lunch. There are consequences for each. For example, sometimes a lunch call was followed by a list of chores after I ate. Adult consequences vary according to the call.

As we heard a couple weeks ago from St. Paul, we are not all blessed with the same charisms and thus are not called to spread God's word and his love the same way. As I noted a couple weeks ago, my mother spread God's love through the charism of hospitality. During Catholic Schools Week we celebrated not only the 100th birthday of our school, but all the St. Joe teachers who shared the faith through the charism of teaching over the past century.

We are all called to share our faith, but first we must know it, so in essence, we are all called to learn it better. A great example is the sacrament of Reconciliation – the act of confessing our sins to a priest. A recent Pew study shows that only 43 percent of active Catholics go to Confession regularly or at least once a year, 23 percent go less than once a year and 33

percent not at all. (The precepts of the Church require us to go at least once a year.) Get to know this sacrament and the need for it this Lent, as Adult Faith Director Amanda Grigar leads us through a three-week series called "Forgiven" presented through the "Formed" app. Last year we had a great turnout for the Formed series on the Eucharist and this year's series will be equally enlightening. Learn the history of the sacrament and why the Church requires it on the first three Thursdays of March.

As for the "being called home" reference in today's title. Let us all pray for all those affected by the two tragic airline disasters last week. They should shake us a bit with the knowledge that we can be called home at any moment. Let's follow God's calls in our lives before he calls us home.

(Thanks to a regular reader who reminded me that this year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea from which we get the proclamation of our faith "The Nicaean Creed" which we recite at each Sunday Mass.)






