Deacon Eric's mind)

Let Me Help You With That BeamSo

"Most of us think that we have more forgiveness to give than to receive. We like to think that more people are unfair or unjust to us than we are to them. Because we think in that way, we find it hard to offer forgiveness, real forgiveness to others."

wrote Fr. Richard McCullen, worldwide leader of Vincentian communities some 30 years ago. His words are a reflection on the part of today's gospel whereby Jesus chastises his disciples for being judgmental of others, when they (and us) should be reflecting on their (our) own wrongdoings. Thus we get today's well known statement of Jesus: "How can you say to your brother 'Brother let me help you with the splinter in your eye' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye?"

This brings me to a great opportunity for all parishioners to have their wooden beams removed from their eyes this Lent. Adult faith director Amanda Grigar will be moderating a three-week group study of the extremely under-utilized sacrament of Reconciliation. If we morph Fr. McCullen's words with Jesus' statement, the necessity for confession becomes obvious. The beams affect our vision as we look into our souls, not allowing us to see our great need for the Lord's forgiveness.

The group study entitled "Forgiven" is built around three videos via Formed, just like last year's study of the Eucharist. Each evening will begin with the video, followed by group discussion. As noted in the church bulletin, the "study will look at the revelation of God's mercy in scripture, make an examination of the Rite itself and allow us to grow a more profound appreciation for this great sacrament." In Amanda's words "confession isn't a rule, a formality or an old-fashioned ritual. It's an intimate and life-changing experience of God's mercy."

This is really an opportunity for all adult

parishioners, whether regular Reconciliation attendees or not, to gain a deeper understanding of the sacrament, and its roots. I previewed the first "Forgiven" episode and found it to be very enlightening, especially a segment when Catholic scholars talked about excuses they have have made in their lives to avoid confession. Perhaps the most-telling one was a scholar who said, "I realized that for a long time, I found myself modifying God's law in my mind to justify my actions, when I should have been modifying my behavior to meet God's law." That's what a beam in our eyes does to us. Let "Forgiven" help to get rid of it.

(I encourage everyone to compliment the "Forgiven" program with a Lent-long study using one of the many on-line apps. There are great studies out there from Matthew Kelley, Bishop Robert Barron, and one on the Hallow app that features, Fr. Mike Schmitz, Jonathan Roumie and Mark Wahlberg. Make this Lent count.)
