

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

What Happened to the Madness? Remember when I was talking about March Madness a couple of weeks ago? Has anyone seen it? Was it even here? I saw March, it came and went. But I never saw the Madness. The Madness involves college basketball -- big upsets in the big tournament, but there were no Cinderella teams beating big-name schools. The top-four teams as seeded before the tournament won and advanced to this weekend's Final Four, so hopefully what the tournament lacked in Madness it will deliver in highly competitive final

But in taking time away from basketball to view the newly-released episodes of season five of "The Chosen," I viewed some "biblical madness." This whole season focuses on the time from Jesus' glorious ride into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through Holy Thursday. The mad-

ness is, as first seen through Jesus eyes, on the temple grounds which has become a center of commerce. It was shortly after arriving in Jerusalem, but the adulation of the afternoon had vaporized for the Lord. As biblical scholar Mary Healy notes: "on that evening, Jesus had 'looked around at everything' in the temple as if to assess its spiritual condition...The temple area had become a marketplace...Instead of the temple sanctifying the city, the city was profaning the temple." He did not not act, but held that image for a day.

Now, we all know the story of Jesus cleansing of the temple, so though there's nothing I will say going forward that I would consider a spoiler alert for those who are planning to watch season five at a later date, which probably means June. All of the gospels have some version of it, with Mark being the most descriptive. But even Mark's version pales to the interpretation director Dallas Jenkins has of Jesus' reaction to what he had seen when he and the apostles returned the next day. Healy say: "Jesus is appalled at this flagrant desecration of a place consecrated to the worship of the living God."

We all know Jesus was angry, but how angry? Well, the Jesus in "The Chosen" is seen by director Jenkins in the cleansing of the temple scene as a little bit Spartacus, a little bit Braveheart, a little bit Incredible Hulk and even a little bit Indiana Jones. No one would get in his way or try to stop him as he overturned the tables of the moneychangers and the seats of those selling doves. He made his point emphatically, and when news spread back to the chief priests and scribes of his actions, they undoubtedly saw a little "madness" in it.

Part two of season five was released this weekend and part three will be released on April 11th . We, of course, will be holding a series of view and discuss sessions at church when all of the episodes have been released to the public sometime this summer.






