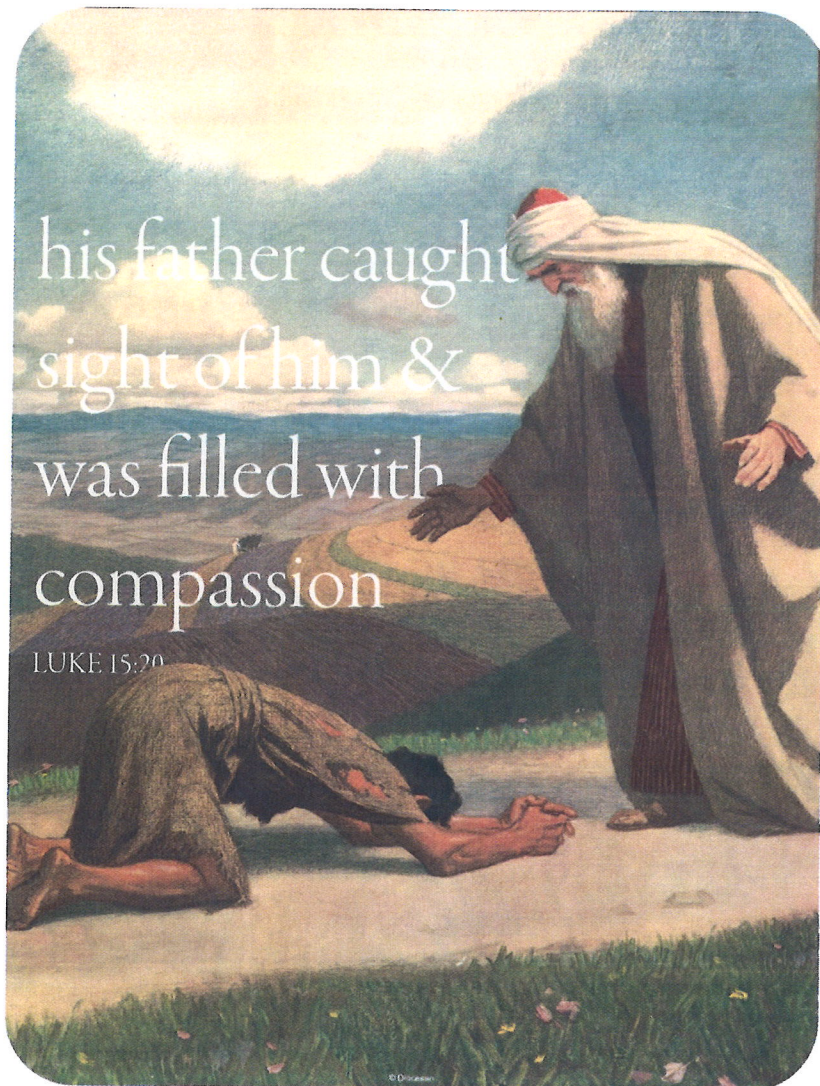

Mercy is Hard

I have a love/hate (well, maybe strong dislike) relationship with today's gospel. I love the parable of the Prodigal Son. I love how I can relate to the three characters Jesus talks about depending on where I'm at in my life. I love the lesson but I hate (well maybe strongly dislike) how easy the father makes forgiveness look. Extending mercy when one has been publicly wronged is hard, especially when it's in the family.

The younger son in the story was clearly in the wrong to ask for his share of the estate. The common practice of landowners was that the family would work the estate and upon the death of the landowner, the property would be split among his children. To ask for one's share while a landowner was alive and healthy was a public slap in the face. It, in essence said: "Dad, you are dead to me."

The younger son was selfish. We would all understand if the father rejected him and left him to suffer the consequences of his actions, but the father not only accepted him back into the family, he threw a banquet for him. I most certainly can relate to being selfish, perhaps not to the level displayed by the younger son, but certainly to a point where it needs to be confessed. And I can certainly relate to being put off, perhaps even angry and jealous, at a self-indulgent brother who's celebrated when he should, theoretically, be disciplined.

It would be hard for many of us who have been wronged by someone in our family to show the mercy shown by the father in this story. This father not only accepted him back, he was on the lookout and ran to his son when he was far off, then embraced and kissed him. Who does that? Really, who does that?

Well, we know the answer. Of course, it is our heavenly Father. And he makes it look so darn easy, when it is not easy. Showing mercy is hard when we have been hurt -- especially within a family. But we can work on it, and that's the ultimate message of

this parable. We all want forgiveness, but we can all use practice in giving it. Let's work on that during the rest of Lent. It's hard but that's what will make it all worthwhile.

NOTE: Last fall, St. Joe's was one of 22 parishes in the greater Lansing area that hosted a representative of Ava Maria Radio in a fund drive to finance the purchase of a radio station that could bring over-the-air Catholic radio to our area. The time is near for that goal to come to fruition -- Ava Maria announced this past weekend at the Diocesan Men's Conference that Catholic radio will be a reality in Lansing April first, or shortly thereafter. It is currently a Christian radio station licensed to Holt, which sends its signal north to cover the Lansing metro area. This will be the third Ave Maria station in Michigan following the initial station in Ann Arbor, then a second in Saginaw. Its programs are also heard on 160 stations across the country. You can find it on 1390 AM on your radio dial.

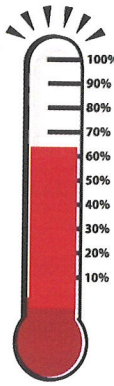
